Dear Parishioners of Buranda, Kangaroo Point and East Brisbane,

I wanted to write to you on this first Sunday as your new Parish Priest, to let you know of my delight, tempered with just a hint of apprehension, at being asked to take on this new appointment, along with my duties as Vicar for Administration. In my 44 years of priesthood I have become used to our God of surprises, so Archbishop Coleridge's request to come back to Brisbane, was just another chapter to add to previous unexpected appointments to the Cathedral, Ipswich, Surfers Paradise and Southport Parishes, as well as being Director of Centacare, Chaplain at Prince Charles hospital and several other interesting appointments.

I am mostly taking over the administrative and pastoral duties offered by Bishop Ken, so I understand this to mean that I am to be available to each of these parishes for the management and provision of sacramental and pastoral services. To assist me in these responsibilities we will have the assistance of Fr. Stephen Camiolo. I am very grateful that the Archbishop has been confident and supportive in assigning us to these historic and significant areas of the Archdiocese. I am also grateful for the strong and encouraging leadership of your previous pastors for the care they have shown in developing the churches and the communities around them.

I am realistic enough to know that that our immediate future will require a great deal of careful planning and discussion, building on

established processes already existing within your parish communities. While this initial planning may take some time, it is my fervent hope that we will be able to continue to provide the range of liturgical and pastoral services presently being offered. In the first few months we shall endeavour to celebrate at least one Sunday mass in each parish, with other services as required. When I have a clearer picture of the numbers and participation of the local community, I may need to make some adjustments. My experiences in large and busy parishes tells me that growth and development of church communities happens when there is a process collaboration, consultation, cooperation and communication between all those involved in parish life. Our task is to find a way to ensure that we have intention and opportunity to allow our parishes to make God's presence clear and accessible to all.

On your part I hope that you will be both patient and supportive with our future endeavours. While I have been given responsibilities across the Archdiocese, I am hopeful that all parishioners will look at the ways they already participate in the life of their parish and Church communities. In these changing times in our Archdiocese and universal Church, we can no longer expect to be waited on or watch from a distance, but must look to our time, talents and resources and ask: "in what ways I am at the service of God through my local community"?
