Local Safeguarding Representative Mrs Catherine Goldsworthy Pope Francis has asked the Church around the world to mark this Sunday as a special celebration for grandparents and the elderly. This is not just because he himself is in his eighty-fifth year but because he wants us all to focus on the real gift of grandparents and the elderly at a time when they can be overlooked or even seem a burden.

Age doesn't always guarantee wisdom but it often does; and wisdom can be in short supply in a culture where we're overloaded with information, where we know the price of everything and the value of nothing. Wisdom requires time to mature; it requires growth through suffering; it means that we take things in our stride and look at the world with a good-humoured eye; it means an ability to remember the stories and to pass them on. Most of these things come only with the passing of the years; and they are what makes late life so potentially rich, even when strength and health dwindle.

Other cultures have regarded the elderly as the guardians of the wisdom upon which the society depended. They were the most important people in the society, and they were often the leaders. Venice, for example, always elected old men as the Doge – some of them in their 80s and 90s - chiefly because they didn't want a leader who was overly ambitious or who would stay too long. But also because they valued the sense of wise balance which came with age. I often think that as a Catholic bishop I am part of a gerontocracy, a government by the elderly, given that I'm still in harness into my 70s and the Pope is years older than me. But then I think of the Queen who's still working in her mid-90s and of President Biden who's heading for 80 as are quite a few of the other political leaders in the USA.

Only what Pope Francis calls "a throwaway culture" sees grandparents and the elderly as a problem or a burden, as past their use-by date. True, the elderly may not be useful in the ways

they once were, but they are uniquely useful in other ways. They can be the teachers of true humanity, which is why they can be such an integral part of a child's upbringing. Children who are denied close contact with grandparents and the elderly are being short-changed. Children need the elderly and the elderly need children. That's where the community of the Church can help undo the silos which keep the young with the young and the elderly with the elderly. It's a community where the elderly rub shoulders with the young, and that's the way God wants it.

So this Sunday think of your own grandparents, living or dead, give thanks for them and pray for them – that they be loved and valued in life or find eternal peace in death. Think of the elderly, whoever they are, and the many gifts they bring. And say a prayer too that the young will always learn from them and walk hand in hand with them on the path that leads to life.
