## A Grain of Truth

Recently it has occurred to me that whenever someone voices their opinion on any topical issue to me, my first tendency is to find in what way I might disagree with them, in what way they might be wrong. Almost everyone feels that their own opinions are good ones; otherwise they wouldn't be sharing them with us. Usually when someone else's opinion does not fall into line with ours we either dismiss it or find fault with it. I am now starting to wonder how many good opinions have I dismissed, how many chances to learn and grow have I passed over, simply because I needed to protect my own judgment or point of view.


Jumping to the negative or defensive position before considering the alternative viewpoint is only the beginning of a prevalent contemporary attitude that seems to encourage people, particularly the young, to think "If you think or do things differently to me then you must be wrong".

This defensive and isolating perspective of "it's my way or the highway" is at the heart of nearly all bias and prejudice, and is usually fed by a fear that our own perspective may not stand up to scrutiny or counter-argument should someone wiser or more committed that myself engage with me in some way. We end up trying to defend an approach that we are either not fully informed or convinced about. I'm not suggesting that we might not be right in our opinion, but we need to know why we are right and allow our viewpoint to stand on its own merits.

Perhaps it's not such a new attitude. It was Jesus' acceptance of the excluded and marginalised that so frustrated the Pharisees and his communing with those considered unacceptable to society that threatened the scribes. It seems that Jesus at least stayed open to the truth that may have been at the foundation of those whose lives were different. Maybe he discovered more about himself by finding out about them.

Perhaps we might practice looking at the situation from a viewpoint different from our own. We could read a book or an article that might be contrary to our own opinion or not automatically disagree with another's argument simply because we always have. We might learn that not all that is true and right is to be found in 'my' way of doing things.

**CONFIRMATION 2023** Last Sunday, 34 children and their families gathered at St Joseph's Kangaroo Point to begin their preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The sacrament of confirmation is the 2<sup>nd</sup> of our initiation into the Church. Confirmation confers special graces of the Holy Spirit upon the person being confirmed, just as such graces were granted to the Apostles on Pentecost. Like baptism, therefore, it can be performed only once, and Confirmation increases and deepens all of the graces granted at baptism.

This Sunday at St. Benedict's and St. Joseph's these children will be enrolled at Mass for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Let us keep these children and their families in our prayers as they journey to their Confirmation on Wednesday night 11<sup>th</sup> October 2023.
